## For singers and 6-String Violin

This is a setting of the Arati Mantra for any number of singers with accompaniment. I have used a traditional melody frequently used for this mantra, as I heard it in the Neem Karoli Baba Ashram in Taos, New Mexico. Vocalists may sing at the notated pitch, or one or two octaves below to suit their ranges. |This is not a call-and-response kirtan; the congregation sings throughour.) Accompaniment is for 6 -string electric violin (tuned from top EADCCF ) with a curved bow such as the BACH .bogen ${ }^{\top \mathrm{M}}$. This bow allows polyphonic play; it is possible to play this work with a standard "straight" bow but it won't work as well. It is suitable to use any ocher instrument, such as keyboard, that has an appropriate range and sound. The harmonic structure is too complex to allow the addition of a drone. The vocal line should be doubled by an instrument.

The pronunciation should be clear from the spelling. The long" i "is like the $i$ in pique.

## Translation

1) Hail Master, Lord of the Universe, Who removes in a moment the troubles of devotees and the sufferings of the poor.
2) One who meditates on You gets the fruit; Sorrow is removed from mind and heart. Happiness and wealth come to the home; Pain is wiped away from the body.
3) You are my Mother and Father in whom I take refuge. No other than You do laccept, of whom 1 accept everything.
4) You are the complete being; You are the knower of all hearts. You are beyond Brahma, the Supreme Lord; You are the Lord of All.
s) You are an ocean of compassion; You are the sustainer. I am the servant, You the Lord. Grant me Your Grace, O Lord.
5) You are the Invisible One, the Protector of all life force. Who else would be the channel through whom the compassion flows?
6) You are the brother of the meek and reliever of their sorrow. You are my savior. Raise your hands in blessing-l am lying at your door.
7) Wipe out worldly faults; take away my sins, O Lord. Increase my faith and devotions in order that I may serve the saints.
